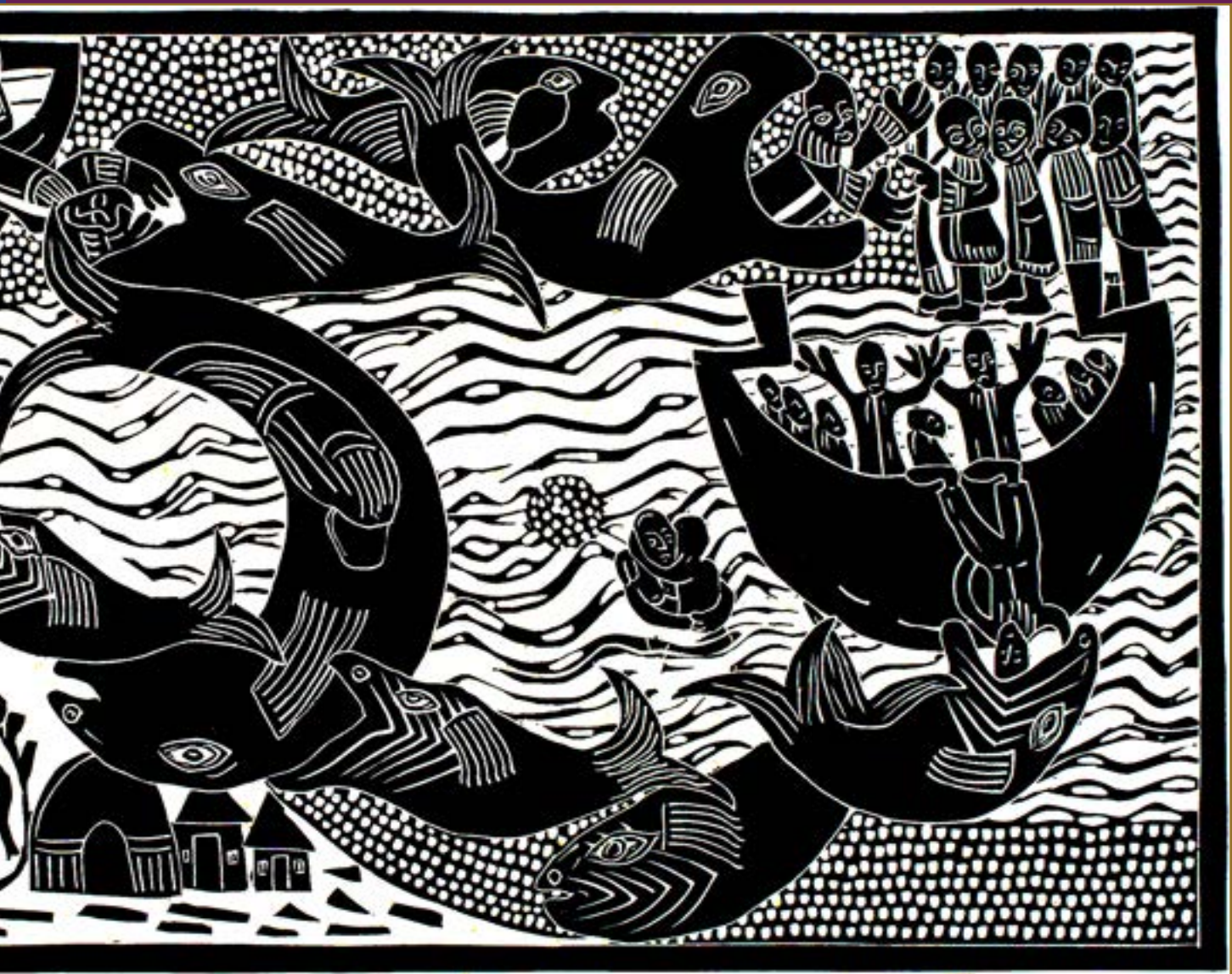

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1. WELCOME

The Centre for Faith and Community is a training centre that is hosted by the University of Pretoria, to focus on the training of community and church leaders in South Africa, the greater African continent and beyond for contextual engagement in their communities.

In addition, the Centre does research, provides consulting services and is the Faculty of Theology's preferred vehicle for community engagement.

Led by specialists in the fields of leadership, healing and pastoral care, organisational and congregational development, and urban and community transformation, the Centre offers a community of learning that fosters personal, organisational and community transformation.

Our core vocation is to enable changemakers, and community and church leaders to insert themselves deeply in local contexts, to read their contexts well, reflect on them theologically and biblically, and to construct ministry responses that will bring about healing and change. Our training supports people to be hopefully present in the real life situations of every day.

Our training is designed to prepare leaders to:

- Address the challenges faced in their communities
- Accompany communities in ways that will address the deeper causes of some of these challenges
- Help communities imagine new and preferred realities for themselves
- Accompany communities in appreciating, retrieving, mobilizing and optimizing their own assets, and
- Help facilitate locally owned ministry practices, processes and programmes that will construct new realities.

This is implemented through studies in leadership development, healing and counselling, congregational and empowering people for ministry, and change-making.

It does not matter whether you have been trained in the past or not, there is a course that will serve your needs.

GENERAL INFORMATION ON COURSES

The Centre for Faith and Community presents a series of courses for community and church leaders, pastors, nonprofit workers, and the general public, all of which are aimed at equipping people for the work of healing, ministry and empowerment in their communities. The courses are designed around the most pressing training needs and are assessed through ongoing research in communities. In this way the Centre ensures that the content of courses remain relevant to the questions and challenges of the day.

CLUSTERS

The Centre offers courses in four interconnected clusters:

1. Leadership Studies
2. Healing and Counselling Studies
3. Organizational and Congregational Studies
4. Urban and Community Transformation Studies

OUR EDUCATIONAL CONTINUUM

Courses: To be allowed into our courses, you need to have a Grade 10 qualification as the minimum requirement. If you do not meet this requirement, you should first complete the introductory courses to become eligible for enrollment into the Basic Courses, Advanced Courses or 12 to 18 month Programmes. No previous training is required for enrollment into the introductory courses. However, if you are eligible for enrollment into the Basic courses, but do not have any prior theological training, you are encouraged to do the introductory courses first, however doing so is not compulsory.

Minimum entry requirements: To enroll for the Basic Courses, you need to have passed Grade 10. If you do not have any theological training, you are encouraged to do the introductory courses first, however this is not compulsory.

- **Basic Courses:** Grade 10 or an equivalent qualification.
- **Advanced Courses:** Grade 12 and at least a two or three year diploma or a university degree is required.
- **Programmes (12 to 18 months):** Grade 12 and at least a three year diploma or a university degree is required. In order to use these programmes as course work towards a post-graduate qualification, please see the next two bullet points.
- **Graduate studies:** Please note that currently our courses do not provide access to graduate

studies (e.g. BTh degree), although we are exploring different options in order to enable students' educational paths optimally.

- *Post-graduate studies:* Students who qualify to register for a Post-graduate Diploma, Honours Degree or Masters Degree at the Faculty of Theology, can use any of the Programmes (12 – 18 month courses) for credits into these qualifications. The credits will be awarded on a case by case basis.

DESIGNED TO EMPOWER

A large part of the Centre's work is to provide in service training to practicing community leaders, ministry workers and pastors who did not have the opportunity to undergo formal training in the past, or who have only received limited training. The basic courses are especially designed for this purpose. These courses can be taken by any members of communities or churches who would like to improve their knowledge and skills for the community action, change-making or ministry that they are involved in.

DURATION OF COURSES

- *Basic Courses* are offered over 3 days or over one year with two weeks of classes to attend over a 6 month period
- *Advanced Courses* are offered over teaching periods ranging from 3 to 10 days
- *Programmes (12 to 18 months)* seven of the advanced long courses are offered over a 12 to 18 month period. The contact sessions are spread over the course duration in five or six teaching blocks, which are one week each in duration. Class attendance is compulsory and assessment is in the form of prescribed books and written or practical assignments.

PROFESSIONAL CREDITS

Our courses are designed as training units (TU), and in specific cases these training units can qualify as professional units (PU), and can be translated into CPD points. You can enquire about CPD points at our office. In order to access some of these credits, students will be required to register with the Professional Body for Religious Practitioners, called the **Association for Christian religious Practitioners (ACRP)** in order to utilise some of our credits.

Credits for Basic courses

- Lasting three days: 1 CPD point per hour
- Lasting one year: 1 CPD point per hour

Credits for Advanced courses

- Lasting three days: 1 CPD point per hour

Credits for Programmes

- Lasting one year: 1 CPD point per hour
- Lasting two years: 1 CPD point per hour



METHOD OF TEACHING

- *Contact weeks*: Differs from course to course and combines interactive lectures with group discussions in a seminar setting. In some courses there is a larger emphasis on site visits, case studies, and real life engagements.
- *Online*: We offer some online courses and some contact courses include online alternatives.
- *Preparation*: Students need to prepare by reading the prescribed material. For Advanced Courses the number of pages is 3200, and for Masters students, approximately 4500. For Advanced Short Courses the number of pages is approximately 1000. For Basic Courses at least 500 pages of study material is prescribed.
- *Evaluation*: Evaluations are done through assignments (homework) as well as open book tests at the beginning of the course, with a brief ‘memory teaser’ at the end of each contact week. Tests are in written or oral format.
- *Participation*: Students are encouraged to share their practical experience in class.

ENGAGED COMMUNITIES

The Centre is an important vehicle for the community engagement of the Faculty of Theology. Our approach, however, is to go beyond engaging communities from the outside only, but rather to insert ourselves in engaged communities as a learner and partner.

- All the programmes of the Centre support and participate in communities, as it provides lifelong and continued educational opportunities to people already actively involved in communities.
- The Unit for Social Cohesion and Reconciliation, the Village of Support and the Urban Studio are practical expressions of community engagement (see Research and Consulting Services).

PERSONAL & CORPORATE COACHING

P002689

Purpose of the Course:

The advanced course in coaching provides exposure to the very wide field of coaching while advancing the ecotone between business organisations and faith-based organisations. It gives special attention to a narrative practice of coaching, spirituality as part of our diversity, and the African context. It develops the knowledge, skills and competencies of the coach on a professional level who will be reckoned as a responsible and competent practitioner in coaching. It reflects on the underlying worldviews and inspires independent thought whilst drawing on interdisciplinary perspectives.

Minimum Admission Requirements

Persons with a tertiary qualification such as a degree or diploma; persons who are already involved in coaching; and persons with a minimum of five years' work experience. This may include thought and business leaders; managers in a corporate environment; people wanting to explore different leadership models as they take responsibility for individuals or teams; consultants, therapists, managers, psychologists, community and church leaders, and formal facilitators.

Note:

Students who qualify to register for an Honours or Master's degree at the Faculty of Theology and Religion at the University of Pretoria, can use this course as part of the structured course work for an Honours/Master's degree in Practical Theology.

Structure and duration of the course:

This is a one year course. There are five periods of contact tuition. Written and practical assignments are done after every week of contact sessions. Each module will consist of theory, consideration of practical work in a specific context, in-depth reflection and integration of information. The modules can be taken individually at a reduced cost if students prefer not to enrol for the whole course because of personal interests or time constraints.

Pastors and other leaders who have matriculated and have a three year diploma in Theology or a degree.

Students who qualify to register for an Honours or Master's degree at the Faculty of Theology and Religion at the University of Pretoria, can use this course as part of the structured course work for an Honours/Master's degree in Practical Theology.

Purpose of the Course:

This course is designed to equip urban practitioners connected with urban challenges with the values, knowledge and skills needed to enable them to serve as incarnational and transformational urban leaders by allowing them to read, re-imagine and reconstruct their communities with many other people. The course will draw from stories of hope from around the world.

Minimum Admission Requirements

People working in faith-based organisations, community organisations, or urban Churches (community, non-profit and church leaders), or those who are generally committed to urban transformation that is socially inclusive; and who have matriculated and have a three year diploma or degree.

Students who qualify to register for an Honours or Master's degree at the Faculty of Theology and Religion at the University of Pretoria, can take this course as part of the structured course work in an Honours or Master's degree in Practical Theology.

YOUTH MINSITRY - AN INCLUSIVE RELATIONAL APPROACH

Purpose of the Course:

Ministering to children and young people in South and Southern African societies is a real opportunity. This course equips pastors and other youth leaders to provide an effective ministry to children, teenagers and young adults within the South and Southern African context, and as part of the local faith community.

Minimum Admission Requirements

Pastors and other leaders who have matriculated and at least have a three diploma in Theology or a degree.

Note:

Students who qualify to register for an Honours or Master's degree at the Faculty of Theology and Religion at the University of Pretoria, can use this course as part of a structured/course work Honours or Master's degree in Practical Theology.

Structure and duration of the course:

This is a one year course, with six periods of contact tuition. Written assignments are done after every contact week. Open book tests are given from the second week of contact tuition.

● **ADVANCED PROGRAMME IN PASTORAL NARRATIVE THERAPY**

P001875

Purpose of the Course:

The need for pastoral care is growing exponentially. This course provides students with exposure to the practice of pastoral care and narrative therapy. Students will be equipped to facilitate hope and healing in a wide variety of situations. In doing so the course equips students to deconstruct and bring hope in areas that are endemic in South African communities. The course is also a foundational training course for Narrative Therapists to register at Signo Professional Association, and for Pastoral Counsellors at CPSC.

Minimum Admission Requirements

Any person who has matriculated and has a three year diploma or degree, or equivalent in RPL recognition, or three years work experience; or who have obtained 30 credits by completing enough Basic Courses at this Centre

Note:

Students who qualify to register for an Honours or Master's degree at the Faculty of Theology at the University of Pretoria, can use this course as part of the structured course work for an Honours or Master's degree in Practical Theology specialising in Narrative Pastoral Counselling.

Structure and duration of the course:

This is a two year course consisting of one lecture per week over 33 weeks, which include in-class practical sessions. Five essay assignments are submitted over this period.

Dates of contact weeks:

The programme commences during the week of 31 January 2025. Modules include pastoral theology, power discourses, working with narrative, relationships, abuse, dependency, trauma, depression and anxiety, children, and adolescence.

• SUPERVISION FOR PASTORAL THERAPISTS

Purpose of the Course:

Because most practitioners of pastoral and narrative counselling have never had the occasion to enter a supervision programme through which they might improve their conversational expertise; this training opportunity provides a rare opportunity for such professionals and professionals from the broader landscape of helping practitioners to participate in a certified course, by leading them down a path toward greater effectiveness in their calling as counsellors and helping practitioners. Even though any person from the helping professions can enrol (these include social work and psychology practitioners, and organisational and ministry leaders), the programme is facilitated from a pastoral and narrative perspective.

Minimum Admission Requirements

Pastoral therapists needing SAQA Level 7 supervision ([option 1](#))

Pastoral therapists needing SAQA Level 9 supervision ([option 2](#))

Structure and duration of the course:

[Option 1](#): 10 mentor/supervision conversations and frequent professional peer contact. Complete in one year but can be extended to two years

[Option 2](#): 15 mentor/supervision conversations and frequent professional peer contact. Complete in 18 months but can be extended to three years

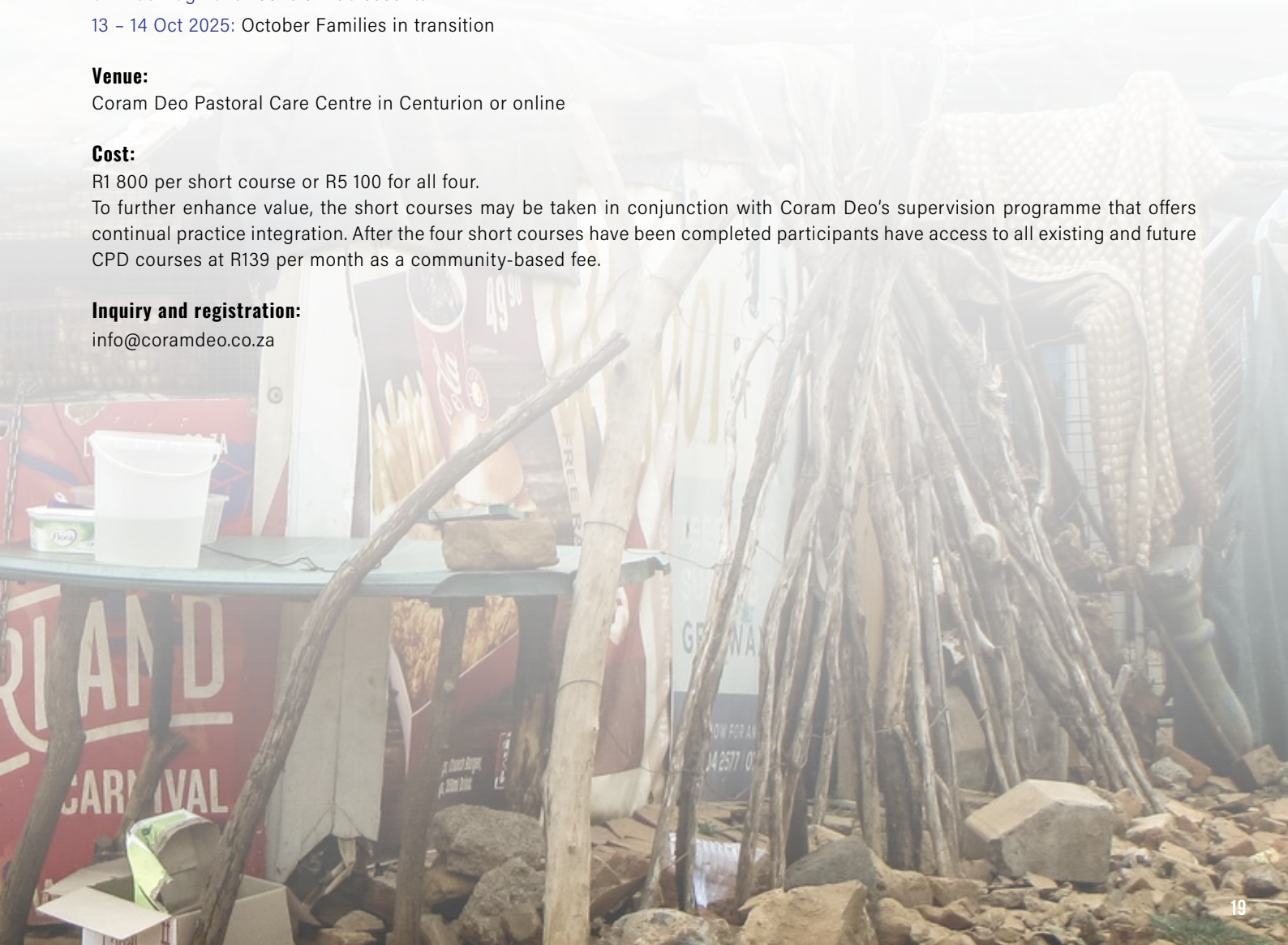

CHILDREN, FAITH AND SOCIETY

Purpose of the Course:

This course is for practitioners and leaders of organisations and ministries dealing with children's issues, and policy makers in the field of child justice. As such, it is a must for practitioners, faith based leaders, other leaders and anyone who is committed to children as a socio-political and theological priority, and who would like to think theologically about the priority of children.

Minimum Admission Requirements

Child advocates or leaders of programmes focused on children, and anyone committed to them and their context as a theological priority who have Grade 12 and a 3 year post-matric qualification.

The course is presented over five days. A homework assignment must be completed. Evaluation is done during the period of contact tuition.

TRAUMA COUNSELLING

Purpose of the Course:

To enable pastors and other counsellors to deal with the process of recovery and healing after a traumatic experience. We live in a traumatised society and the church and/or the pastoral counsellor is often the only immediate or available resource for support and guidance.

Minimum Admission Requirements

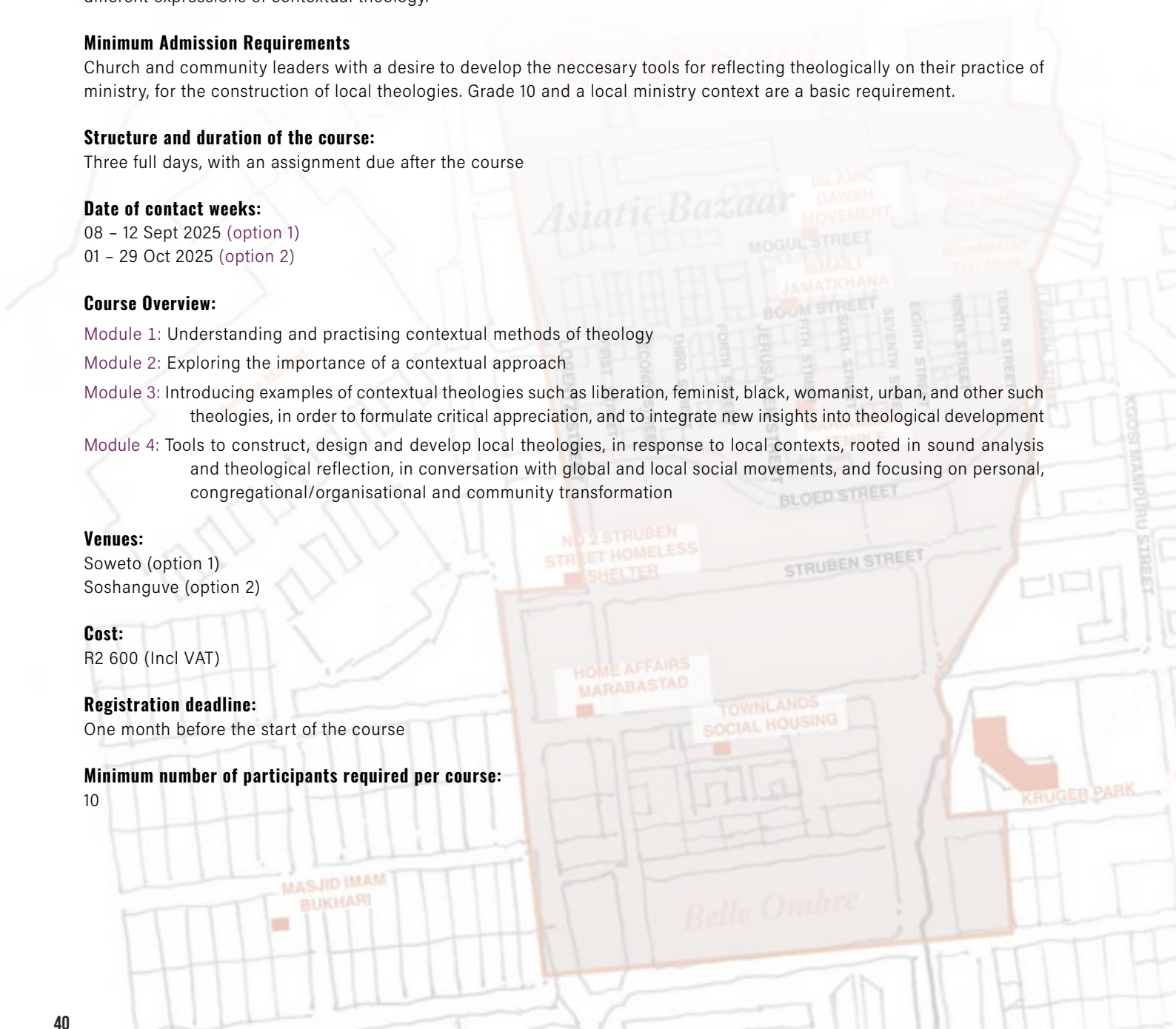
